SYNOPSIS

Aspiring rock star Joby Taylor (Paul Dano- THERE WILL BE BLOOD, LITTLE MISS SUNSHINE) has wanted nothing more than to "make it", having flirted with fame but never crossed over into true success. In the midst of a low period in his life, he agrees to sign divorce papers with his estranged wife (Margarita Levieva- "Revenge," "How To Make It In America") in order to see money from the sale of their home, only to discover that by signing the papers, he will forfeit all custody of his six-year-old daughter, Ellen (newcomer Shaylena Mandigo). With a good-natured lawyer (Jon Heder- NAPOLEON DYNAMITE) unable to make headway in reversing the decision, and a girlfriend (Jena Malone- INTO THE WILD) that represents an era of his life that he might be ready to graduate from, Joby negotiates a visit with his daughter to explore whether he is able to walk away from his child, and whether it might be too late for reconciliation.

DI RECT OR'S ST AT EMEN T

With each film I have been learning, not just about filmmaking, but also about life and myself.

I started to write FOR ELLEN when I was filled with anxiety and doubts about being a decent parent, a loving partner, and a filmmaker. Our daughter had just turned two-years old and we were struggling with the release of our second films. My anxiety was great. This led to thoughts of my own father, whom I had only met once before when I was five. For the first time in my life, I felt a need to understand him better. While imagining why a man might leave his family, a character began to take shape. I was curious about the effect this father's return could have on his child and himself. Through this investigation, Joby Taylor, a young struggling musician, came to be.

Originally, Joby's character was in his mid-thirties. I was imagining someone who had failed at the early part of their life and was now looking back. However, my idea for the character changed when Paul Dano read the script and suggested that he play Joby. The change in the character's age left the ending open for different possibilities. I liked this potential and felt lucky at the opportunity to cast him as the lead.

Shaylena Mandigo who plays Ellen was discovered at an elementary school in Massena, New York where we shot the film. We visited an elementary school and watched the kids play in gym class. We then selected and interviewed students from Kindergarten to second grade. Shay was the smallest kid in her class, but she stood out as a focused and serious student. After interviewing her, I felt she had the maturity to play the role. Paul and Shay met for the first time a few days before we started shooting their scenes together.

We had an intense production with just enough budget for an 18 day shoot. During the filming the temperature would dip below zero. It was extremely challenging, especially for our actor Paul Dano, who was only dressed in a thin leather jacket. There was a flu going around and Paul was hit hard with it. He had a fever over 104 and it wouldn't go down so we had to take him to the emergency room in town. We were not sure if we would be able to finish. We didn't have a back-up plan and thought maybe we had to pack it up. We lost two days but thankfully Paul pulled through and with the help of the crew, we finished the shoot with enough footage to complete the film.

My husband, Brad, and I attended college in Chicago, Illinois. During our school days we took many trips to visit his farming relatives located throughout the mid- west. These road trips made a deep impression on me. Every town seemed to be struggling to stay alive. The story takes place during the winter. The stark beauty of the vast farmlands and the desolation of the small towns are intended to serve as a backdrop to Joby's emotional journey.

FOR ELLEN is a character study of a man who's conflicted with the decisions he's made in his life. Although Joby is a particular type of person, I believe the challenges he faces are universal.

ABOUT THE CAST

PAUL DANO (Joby and Executive Producer)

Paul Dano is currently in the midst of a long period of wildly varied, challenging, intriguing work.

This summer, Dano reteams with LITTLE MISS SUNSHINE'S Jonathan Dayton and Valerie Faris for RUBY SPARKS (Fox Searchlight), written by and co-starring Zoe Kazan. Dano plays a successful novelist struggling with writer's block who finds romance in a most unusual way: by creating a female character he thinks will love him, then willing her into existence.

September 28 marks the release of LOOPER (TriStar Pictures), Rian Johnson's sci-fi thriller that features Dano in a pivotal appearance alongside Joseph Gordon-Levitt. This spring, Dano starred opposite Robert De Niro in BEING FLYNN (Focus Features), Paul Weitz's adaptation of Nick Flynn's celebrated memoir *Another Bullshit Night in Suck City*.

Later this summer, Dano will play a slave owner in Steve McQueen's TWELVE YEARS A SLAVE (New Regency), the screen version of Solomon Northup's novel about a free black man who, promised a job playing violin in the circus, is drugged and dragged to Louisiana and sold into slavery. The cast also includes Chiwetel Ejiofor, Michael Fassbender, Brad Pitt and Adepero Oduye.

For his work opposite Brian Cox in Michael Cuesta's L.I.E., Dano earned an Independent Spirit Award for Best Debut Performance. For LITTLE MISS SUNSHINE, he garnered a second Spirit Award nomination, a Broadcast Film Critics Association Award for Best Young Actor and a Screen Actors Guild Award (ensemble) with cast mates Alan Arkin, Abigail Breslin, Steve Carell, Toni Collette and Greg Kinnear.

The following year, Dano earned a BAFTA Award nomination for Best Supporting Actor opposite Academy Award winner Daniel Day-Lewis in Paul Thomas Anderson's THERE WILL BE BLOOD.

Dano's film credits also include Kelly Reichardt's MEEK'S CUTOFF, Jon Favreau's COWBOYS & ALIENS, Spike Jonze's WHERE THE WILD THINGS ARE (as the goat-like Alexander), James Mangold's KNIGHT AND DAY, Dagur Kári's THE GOOD HEART with Cox, Matt Aselton's GIGANTIC (which also marked his first executive producer credit), Ang Lee's TAKING WOODSTOCK, Richard Linklater's FAST FOOD NATION, James Marsh's THE KING, Rebecca Miller's THE BALLAD OF JACK AND ROSE with Day-Lewis, D.J. Caruso's TAKING LIVES, Luke Greenfield's THE GIRL NEXT DOOR, Michael Hoffman's THE EMPEROR'S CLUB and Shari Springer Berman and Robert Pulcini's THE EXTRA MAN, both with Kevin Kline.

Growing up in Manhattan and Connecticut, Dano began his career on the New York stage with roles in Broadway productions of *Inherit the Wind*, opposite George C. Scott and Charles Durning and *A Christmas Carol*, with Ben Vereen and Terrence Mann. He returned to the stage in 2007 in The New Group's off-Broadway production of Jonathan Marc Sherman's *Things We Want*, directed by Ethan Hawke and starring Peter Dinklage, Josh Hamilton, and Zoe Kazan. In late 2010, he appeared with Jeffrey Wright and Mos in the world premiere of John Guare's *A Free Man of Color*, directed by George C. Wolfe at Lincoln Center Theatre.

JON HEDER (Butler)

Jon Heder became an overnight sensation and gained an instant cult following with his feature film debut in the title role of the offbeat comedy NAPOLEON DYNAMITE. Heder's endearing portrayal of the somewhat nerdy high schooler who helps his friend Pedro get elected class president was a huge box office success and brought him two MTV Movie Awards, one in the category of Breakthrough Male and a second for Best Musical Performance for his crowd-pleasing election night dance. Heder met NAPOLEON DYNAMITE director Jared Hess while both were studying film at Brigham Young University; the director first cast him in a short film, PELUCA.

In 2007, Heder starred opposite Will Ferrell in the hit comedy BLADES OF GLORY, which has taken in close to \$120 million dollars at the domestic box office. Later that year he starred in MAMA'S BOY opposite Diane Keaton and Jeff Daniels. In the summer of 2007, Heder returned to animation in Columbia Pictures' SURF'S UP after previously voicing a role in Columbia Pictures' MONSTER HOUSE.

Heder also starred in the feature films THE BENCHWARMERS, SCHOOL FOR SCOUNDRELS, JUST LIKE HEAVEN with Reese Witherspoon and Mark Ruffalo and WHEN IN ROME with Josh Duhmel and Kristen Bell.

Heder studied Film and Computer Animation at Brigham Young University, and works and lives in Los Angeles with his wife and children.

JENA MALONE (Susan)

As a rising actress distinguished by her versatility and multidimensional roles, Jena Malone continues to evolve with each new project.

Malone was most recently seen opposite Kevin Costner and Bill Paxton in the History Channel's mini-series "Hatfields & McCoy's" which is based on a true story, and chronicles the bloody hostilities between two clans that escalated to the point of near war between two states.

Malone will soon begin production on THE GO GETTERS. The film is an LA noir thriller about a struggling actress (Malone) who gets caught up in a heist planned by two underworld brothers. She was also recently cast in the upcoming HUNGER GAMES sequel, CATCHING FIRE.

Malone was recently seen in the independent feature IN OUR NATURE opposite John Slattery and Zach Gilford about an estranged father and son who are forced to share a vacation home with their respective girlfriends after a scheduling mistake. The film premiered at SXSW as well as the Sarasota Film Festival.

Malone is set to star in a web-based series directed by Ami Mann titled, "Dakota." The series of webisodes is part of WIGSa new YouTube channel that is producing high-end, original, scripted series about the lives of women from all walks of life. WIGS has also attracted the talents of Jennifer Garner, Alfred Molina, Stephen Moyer, Virginia Madsen, Julia Stiles, Maura Tierney, Michael C. Hall, and America Ferrera, who will all star in the various series which are scheduled to begin airing this May.

Later this year, Malone will be seen in THE WAIT, opposite Chloe Sevigny about two sisters who decide to keep their deceased mother in their home after being informed that she will come back to life. Malone is currently in production on the highly anticipated film, LONELY HUNTER. In this biopic, Malone will star in the title role as Carson McCullers'.

In 2011, Malone starred in Zack Snyder's, SUCKER PUNCH, for Warner Bros. opposite Emily Browning and Abbie Cornish. In the action film, five young women use their imaginations to escape their bleak reality being held prisoner in a mental hospital.

Previously, Malone starred in Oren Moverman's THE MESSENGER, Sean Penn's INTO THE WILD, Anthony Minghella's COLD MOUNTAIN, Brian Dannelly's SAVED! and Joe Wright's PRIDE AND PREJUDICE. As a young actress, Malone starred opposite Julia Roberts and Susan Sarandon in STEPMOM, the cult classic, DONNIE DARKO and her very first role in the independent film BASTARD OUT OF CAROLINA which earned her an Independent Spirit Award nomination for Best Debut Performance.

Malone has guest starred on several television series including "Law & Order" and "Chicago Hope," and her performance in the TV film "Hope" earned Malone a Golden Globe nomination for Best Performance by an Actress in a Mini-Series or Motion Picture Made for TV.

Malone currently resides in Los Angeles.

MARGARITA LEVIEVA (Claire)

Margarita Levieva is currently filming ABC'S "Revenge" opposite Madeleine Stowe and Emily VanCamp. Levieva recently finished filming LOFT opposite Karl Urban and James Marsden. Levieva can be seen in KNIGHTS OF BADASSDOM with Peter Dinklage, Summer Glau, Ryan Kwanten, and Steve Zahn. In addition, Margarita has also been seen in HBO's "How To Make It In America."

Levieva appeared last year in Lakeshore's LINCOLN LAWYER opposite Matthew McConaughey, Marisa Tomei, and Ryan Phillippe. Levieva is most widely known for her role of 'Lisa P' in ADVENTURELAND opposite Jesse Eisenberg, Kristen Stewart, and Ryan Reynolds, which was released by Miramax in March 2009. The film premiered at the 2009 Sundance Film Festival along with SPREAD, directed by David Mackenzie, where Levieva was opposite Ashton Kutcher.

Levieva made her Broadway debut in *Impressionism*, an American play by Michael Jacobs. Margarita starred opposite Joan Allen and Jeremy Irons in the story of a world-traveling photojournalist and a New York gallery owner who help repair each others' broken lives. Her next play, *The Retributionists* by Daniel Goldfarb and directed by Leigh Silverman, opened in September 2009.

She also starred in the independent film NOISE opposite Tim Robbins, William Hurt and Bridget Moynahan and in THE INVISIBLE opposite Justin Chatwin and Marcia Gay Harden. On television, Margarita starred in FOX's "Vanished." Other television credits include "Law & Order: Trial By Jury" and the pilots "What's Not To Love," "NY 70" and "The Prince."

A native of St. Petersburg, Russia, Levieva began the rigorous training program of a competitive gymnast at the age of three. As a member of the Russian rhythmic gymnastics Olympic team,

Levieva continued to train for the next 13 years, winning competitions in Russia and eventually going on to compete in the United States.

When she was 11, her mother moved her and her twin brother to New York, where she later studied economics at NYU. Her true passion, however, had always been acting and she ultimately was accepted into the Meisner Training Program at the prestigious William Esper Studio.

Levieva currently resides in New York/Los Angeles.

ABOUT THE FILMMAKERS

JEN GATIEN (Producer)

Jen Gatien was born in the Native community of Akwesasne in Canada. She graduated from Columbia University with a degree in Film and Anthropology in 1997. During her senior year, she interned at October Films to learn the world of independent film under Bingham Ray and John Schmidt.

Jen began her career as a producer with a project that documented the lives of club kids called SHAMPOO HORNS. In 2000, she has teamed up with Akiva Goldman's production shingle, Weed Road Pictures, to develop a film about Rudy Guiliani's campaign to clean up New York leading to the "Disneyesque" re-development of the once gritty Times Square. Jen then went onto become the American producer of the global project 1 GIANT LEAP which includes collaborations with Bono, Susan Sarandon, Dennis Hopper, Courtney Love, Michael Stipe among others. The project represents a unique combination of music and documentary film. In her constant search for compelling material, Jen discovered HOUND DOG. The script had been without financing for more than ten years. Jen raised the funding for the film through her company, Deerjen in 2006, and began filming in North Carolina with leading actresses Dakota Fanning and Robin Wright Penn. The film premiered in official competition in 2007 at the Sundance Film Festival.

As a longtime resident of the Chelsea Hotel, Jen faced being forced out of this renowned artists' sanctuary by the new management in 2007, so she recruited one time resident Abel Ferrara to direct CHELSEA ON THE ROCKS. Using archival footage, interviews and re-enactments, the film premiered as official selection at the Cannes Film Festival 2008. The film stars Ethan Hawke, Dennis Hopper, Adam Goldberg, R Crumb, Bijou Phillips, Grace Jones and Milos Forman.

Based on real life events, Jen next produced HOLY ROLLERS starring Jesse Eisenberg, which premiered as US competition at Sundance 2010. In 2011, Magnolia Pictures released LIMELIGHT which premiered at HotDocs and then the Tribeca Film Festival. She produced Bradley Rust Gray's JACK AND DIANE, at the Tribeca Film Festival in 2012 which is being released by Magnolia Pictures. She is currently in post-production on Xan Cassavetes' KISS OF THE DAMNED, which will close Venice Critics Week, and EVOLUTION OF A CRIMINAL.

Jen served on the jury of the Oldenburg Film Festival and is a board member of the New Wave Film Society of Lincoln Center.

BRADLEY RUST GRAY (Producer)

Gray's first narrative feature, SALT, was filmed in Iceland and won the Caligari Film Prize for Innovative Filmmaking at Berlin in 2003. His follow up directorial feature, THE EXPLODING GIRL, starring Zoe Kazan and Mark Rendall, premiered at Berlin Film Festival and won the Best Actress Prize at Tribeca Film Festival. His most recent directorial feature is JACK AND DIANE, which premiered at the 2012 Tribeca Film Festival, and will be released by Magnolia. Gray has produced two feature films by So Yong Kim. FOR ELLEN will be his third producing effort.

SO YONG KIM (Director, Writer, Producer)

FOR ELLEN is So Yong Kim's third feature film. Her critically acclaimed second feature TREELESS MOUNTAIN was released by Oscilloscope Laboratories and received numerous awards worldwide. Kim's first feature, IN BETWEEN DAYS, was acclaimed by critics and won the Special Jury Prize at the 2007 Sundance Film Festival along with the International Critics' Prize at Berlin. Kino International and the Sundance Channel released the film. Kim has produced three films by Bradlye Rust Gray: SALT, THE EXPLODING GIRL and JACK & DIANE
